The proposed amendment would result in significantly more abortions and fewer live School District births per year in Florida. The increase in Referendum abortions could be even greater if the amendment invalidates laws requiring Renewal of the Existing One Mill Ad Valorem Tax for School District Operating parental consent before minors undergo abortions and those ensuring only licensed physicians perform abortions. There is also Shall the Alachua County School District's uncertainty about whether the amendment existing one mill ad valorem tax be renewed, will require the state to subsidize abortions beginning July 1, 2025 and ending four years with public funds. Litigation to resolve those later on June 30, 2029, for necessary and other uncertainties will result in operating expenses to fund school nurses; additional costs to the state government and music, art and drama programs; school state courts that will negatively impact the state budget. An increase in abortions may library programs; school counseling programs; band and chorus programs; negatively affect the growth of state and local academic magnets; career technical revenues over time.
