### Want to Vote-By-Mail?

Requests for Vote-By-Mail ballots must be made no later than 12 days prior to Election Day. All voted Vote-By-Mail ballot must be in the Supervisor's Office by 7 p.m. on Election Day, in order to be counted.

### Signature Update

Any time there is a change in your signatuor identifying "mark", you must complete a new registration application & submit it to the Elections Office. If your signature on your voter record and the signature on your Vote-By-Mail ballot do not match, yo Vote-By-Mail ballot will not count.

Completed Vote-by-Mail ballots can be dropped off at any Early Voting site during the Early Voting period, October 26th November 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2024. Mail Ballots may not be dropped off at the polling place on Election Day.

### Requirement for Voters

You must show a valid photo and signature ID when voting early or at the polls. Voters who do not show a valid photo and signature ID must vote a provisional ballot (F.S. 101.043(2)).
